Black History Month

Every February, people across Canada observe Black History Month by participating in events and festivities that honour the legacy of Black Canadians and their communities.

In December 1995, the House of Commons officially recognized February as Black History Month in Canada following a <u>motion</u> introduced by <u>Dr. Jean Augustine</u>. The House of Commons carried the motion unanimously.

In February 2008, <u>Senator Donald Oliver</u>, the first Black man appointed to the Senate, introduced the <u>Motion to Recognize</u> <u>Contributions</u> of Black Canadians and February as Black History Month. It received unanimous approval and was adopted on March 4, 2008. The adoption of this motion completed Canada's parliamentary position on Black History Month.
